

Journal of Law and Society and the Centre of Law and Society Special Issue Workshop

This is an open call to conduct a workshop potentially leading to a Special Research Issue of the Journal of Law and Society (subject to quality and space considerations) organised through the <u>Cardiff Centre of Law and</u> <u>Society</u>.

The workshop must be designed not just to showcase excellent socio-legal research but also focus on a central theme of current importance to the socio-legal community. Workshops are usually two or three days long; must be held in person;, are to be held at Cardiff's School of Law and Politics; and must include one member of the JLS editorial board (see the website for details of the board) so that the editorial board has oversight of the project. In the past, our workshops have included around 12-15 papers, and provide the opportunity for stimulating discussion of papers and the workshop themes, leading to outstanding publications.

The Centre has allowed a budget of £3,000 for the workshop.

The Centre will prioritise those applications that have a clear proposal that includes PGRs and ECRs and has an additional focus on ECR/PGR development.

All proposals must include a reflection on how their application enhances equality, diversity and inclusion within the academy.
