



SeNSS Socio-Legal Conference: Using Quantitative Methods in Socio-Legal Research

This two day event aims to advance understanding of socio-legal research within SeNSS (South-East Network for Social Sciences) socio-legal pathway institutions (Essex, Kent, UEA, Reading and Sussex). Day one will be a training day on 'using quantitative methods in socio-legal research'. Day two will provide an opportunity to showcase socio-legal research from researchers at SeNSS institutions. The event is open to academics and socio-legal PhD students at all SeNSS institutions but places are limited and registration is required.

This two day event, to be held on 18 and 19 May 2020 at the University of Essex, is specifically targeted at those who adopt a socio-legal approach to their research but who wish to explore and learn more about quantitative methods. Day one will include training from experts on quantitative methods, including topics as follows: an introduction to quantitative methods in socio-legal research, survey design, sampling, introduction to statistical analysis. Day two will provide researchers with an opportunity to present their own work on any socio-legal topic.
